President's Column Steve LaVergne

Our **January** meeting will feature 20 **circuit books from the American Philatelic Society**. Having screened these books, I am confident the club will reach the \$200 threshold for waiver of the five-percent surcharge.

The club will ask members to add a five-percentage surcharge to their purchases. This will defray mailing costs. Without the waiver, the club would need to assess a ten-percent surcharge.

The circuit books arrived just before Christmas. Here are the areas, with highlights, covered by the books. The typical highlight includes catalog value and asking price.

- 1. Australian states. Highlight: Queensland 74; \$62.50, \$15
- 2. German area, overseas offices and colonies. Highlight: six German telegraph stamps
- 3. United States 268 (3-cent bureau) unused strip of three, \$440, \$125
- 4. China Sinkiang. Highlight: 128-35 mint; \$37, \$37.50
- 5. Australia. Highlight: Australia 7; \$50, \$12
- 6. Netherlands. Highlight: Netherlands 51, \$15, \$3.
- 7. Peru. Highlight: Peru 112, \$8.75, \$4.35
- 8. Animals and flowers: Highlight: FSAT C132 MNH, \$13, \$5
- 9. United States mostly Washington-Franklins. Highlight: USA 527 MNH, \$40, \$30
- 10. United States mint singles. Highlight: USA 627 (2-cent sesquicentennial) MNH, \$5, \$2
- 11. German area. Highlight: Bavaria railway stamps
- 12. United States plate blocks of six. Four blocks of 554c, with different plate numbers
- 13. French Africa. Highlight: two-plus pages of Somali Coast "France Libre" overprints
- 14. United States. Highlight: USA 235 (six-cent Columbian), \$25, \$6
- 15. Great Britain Victorian era. Highlight: GB 73, \$400, \$40
- 16. New Zealand. Highlight: NZ 85a (lake color variety), \$50, \$20
- 17. Italy and colonies. Highlight: Italian colonies 27, \$24, \$8.90
- 18. Baltic nations. Highlight: Lithuania 116-19C (12 stamps) mint, \$15, \$5
- 19. United States plate blocks of four, 1922 definitives
- 20. Cuba. Highlight: Cuba 57, \$75, \$25

You read right. The APS member is asking catalog value and more for his Sinkiang set. This is consistent with the prices listed for the other Sinkiang issues. We have noticed that for China stamps, dealers are charging more than their customary percentages of catalog value.

More dealers seem to notice that the Scott catalog states that postally used PRC stamps are worth just as much as mint varieties and are pricing such material accordingly.
